

**TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF DOVER REGULAR MEETING, MARCH 25, 2009**

The Town Board of the Town of Dover held a regular meeting on March 25, 2009 at 6:30 pm at the Dover Town Hall, 126 East Duncan Hill Road, Dover Plains, New York with the following members present:

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Supervisor Courtien called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Everyone stood for the pledge of allegiance to the flag. Mr. Courtien asked for a minute of silent prayer for the loss of Armando Mostachetti, a life resident and past supervisor who was memorialized later in the meeting.

**II. DISCUSSION**

**a. REBUILDING TOGETHER DUTCHESS**

Councilman Galayda introduced David E. Dobson, Executive Director, Rebuilding Together, in Dutchess County. Mr. Dobson mentioned the organization was founded in 1992, largest not-for-profit home renovation, there is no cost to homeowners. They are formerly known as Christmas in April. They make a home warm, safe and dry for people of a low-income level, many are veterans, senior citizens and handicapped. Project repairs may be for roofing, bathroom, kitchen, wheelchair ramps and general clean up. The not-for-profit group are supported by many banks in Dutchess County, many supply companies. The projects are mostly a one-day, having from 15 to 20 workers and some from 40 to 50 workers. Mr. Dobson mentioned a town might help by waiving building permit fee for permits. He mentioned twenty projects scheduled for April 25, 2009. A short video was shown of one day of improvements from start to finish for a World War II veteran's home. Mr. Dobson asked for volunteers to help keep these people in their homes.

**b. DOVER KNOLLS DEIS**

The Supervisor mentioned the Dover Knolls Development project, DEIS review was returned to the developer with twenty pages for completeness of the Town's concerns. The reply from Dover Knolls is expected soon. The Town will have to respond in thirty days. The Supervisor spoke of the possibility of a workshop to review their response.

**c. JUSTICE COURT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM GRANT**

The Supervisor spoke of the two grants the town received for the Justice Department courtroom security. The plan is to upgrade the courtroom and then to use that as a meeting room.

**d. LOCAL LAW CHANGES**

The Supervisor mentioned the Town Clerk's recommendation to amend the town code to omit the requirement that Building permits be filed in the Town Clerk's office. He also spoke of several additional town code proposed changes. The Town Board members will review the codes to make amendment suggestions.

Supervisor Courtien changed the agenda to hear the residents from Cart Road.

**CART ROAD RESIDENTS COMMENTS**

Jerry Ranita, a resident, spoke of his remarks not being against the highway crew. He mentioned he moved here in 1995 with about 10 houses and now there are about 20 homes. He spoke that a lot of people use the road who do not live on Cart Road. Mr. Ranita spoke of the muddy road this year, remarking we can't get in or out and two cars had to be towed out from the mud costing \$100.00 each. He gave the Supervisor photographs of the road conditions. Mr. Ranita wanted something to be done to repair the road.

Joanne Graham, Highway Superintendent, spoke of meeting with the engineer about a fabric/netting that may be used. She spoke of rebuilding the road with a mesh and then build the road back up again. She mentioned there are 29 miles of dirt roads in the towns. She added the problem with the roads going out this year was the tremendous change in temperatures so quickly.

A Cart Road resident spoke of applying for the NY State chips program for road restructure.

The Highway Superintendent responded to say the town does receive this funding, and mentioned the requirements for this road funding.

John Murray, a Cart Road resident, does not want the road closed off because of services such as garbage pick up and that his wife has secures that may require emergency services.

John Hildenbrand, a Cart Road resident, thanked the Town Board for listening to their concerns. He asked for a good faith to support repairs of a portion of the road each year. Something to alleviate our concerns for the future for in three or four years the road would be repaired.

Joseph Egan, a Cart Road resident, spoke of the issue of safety, if the road is not taken care of properly. He mentioned simple preventative maintenance .

Cindy Lalli, a Cart Road resident, mentioned she is patient for the repairs being done over a period of years. She paid for her babysitter's car to be towed to her house. She is concerned about safety and to build the road from the bottom up.

Joel Pelkey, Highway Forman, spoke of the problems with not having the funding to make repairs. He spoke the grant money has to meet certain criteria for the size of the roads and residential income. He mentioned the unusual quick temperature change with the frost coming out of the ground had a lot to do with the damage to the roads.

Supervisor Courtien mentioned he would speak with the Highway Superintendent to develop a short and long term plan. He will speak with the Dutchess County Planning Department for census tracking income data. Mr. Courtien suggested two representatives on the Cart Road could point out the areas of concern next week to the Highway Department to move forward.

**RECESS** – The Supervisor recessed the meeting at 8:52 pm.

**RETURN TO MEETING** - The Supervisor called the meeting back to order at 8:59 pm.

**IV. REPORTS OF COUNCILMEMBERS AND SUPERVISOR**

Councilwoman Palmer-House reported all members are participating and the All Hazard Mitigation is moving forward. A Draft plan could be ready as early as May. The Councilwoman mentioned roadside cleanup would be in May. She mentioned about reaching out to the community residents by way of the towns website with "Dover Cares". Ms. Palmer-House mentioned she has volunteered to write a grant for the Dover Little League. The grant application requires a dollar match for each grant dollar and asked the town if they would help with the amount of \$3,000 if the grant were awarded.

Councilwoman Frame mentioned next month a representative from the Dutchess County Economic Development will attend the Town Board meeting.

Councilman Hawthorne, spoke of following up on the road problems. He mentioned the great work done by the Highway Department.

Christopher Galayda spoke of a golf outing benefit for the Center of Compassion to be held at the HV Golf Club.

He mentioned about working with the ARB and the attorney to amend the sign ordinance and he is looking for suggestions from the Town Board members.

Supervisor Courtien spoke of the \$1.2 million bridge replacement on Nellie Hill Road from the Federal Government. The Dutchess County Transportation Council will provide funding for the rehabilitation of the Lime Kiln Bridge. He mentioned the Windrose development project would apply to the Town Board for a zoning change.

**V. REPORT OF DUTCHESS COUNTY LEGISLATOR**

Peter Wassell, Dutchess County Legislator for Dover, spoke about the consolidation projects in critical to move into consolidation. The sharing could be in recreation, sheriff services, etc. A town will be able participate or not participate. He mentioned he will be sponsoring a ground water contamination resolution.

AUTHORIZING ACQUISITION AND FINANCING OF 2009 CHEVY CK 3100-3 4 WHEEL DRIVE  
HEAVY DUTY DUMP TRUCK**

Whereas, Town of Dover (“the Lessee”), a body politic and corporate duly organized and existing as a political subdivision, municipal corporation or similar public entity of the State of New York, is authorized by the laws of the State of New York to purchase, acquire and lease personal property for the benefit of the Lessee and its inhabitants and to enter into contracts with respect thereto; and

Whereas, the Lessee desires to purchase, acquire and lease certain equipment constituting personal property necessary for the Lessee to perform essential governmental functions, specifically a 2009 Chevy CK 3100-3 4 Wheel Drive Heavy Duty Dump Truck with 8 ½ foot plow (equipment); and

Whereas, in order to acquire such equipment, the Lessee proposes to enter into that certain Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement ( the “Agreement”) with Real Lease, Inc. (the “Lessor”), the form of which has been presented to the governing body of the Lessee at this meeting; and

Whereas, the governing body of the Lessee deems it for the benefit of the Lessee and for the efficient and effective administration thereof to enter into the Agreement for the purchase, acquisition and leasing of the equipment therein described on the terms and conditions therein provided;

**Now, Therefore, Be It And It Is Hereby Resolved;**

*Section 1. Approval of Documents.* The form, terms and provisions of the Agreement are hereby approved in substantially the form presented at this meeting, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by counsel of the Lessee or other members of the governing body of the Lessee executing the same, the execution of such documents being conclusive evidence of such approval ; and the Supervisor of the Lessee is hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the Town Clerk of the Lessee is hereby authorized and directed to attest and countersign the Agreement and affix the seal of the Lessee to such documents.

*Section 2. Other Actions Authorized.* The officers and employees of the Lessee shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to the Agreement to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated thereby and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any closing and other documents required to be delivered in connection with the Agreement.

*Section 3. No General Liability.* Nothing contained in this Resolution, the Agreement nor any other instrument shall be construed with respect to the Lessee as incurring a pecuniary liability or charge upon the general credit of the Lessee or against its taxing power, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this Resolution, the Agreement or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith impose any pecuniary liability upon the Lessee or any charge upon its general credit or against its taxing power, except to the extent that the Rental Payments payable under the Agreement are special limited obligations of the Lessee as provided in the Agreement.

*Section 4. Section 265(b)(3) Designation.* Lessee hereby designates the Agreement as a “qualified tax-exempt obligation” for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Lessee further represents that Lessee reasonably anticipates that Lessee and other entities that Lessee controls will not issue tax-exempt obligations (including the Agreement) that exceed the aggregate principal amount of \$10,000,000 during the calendar year in which the Agreement is executed and delivered.

*Section 5. Severability.* If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

*Section 6. Repealer.* All bylaws, orders and resolutions or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed as reviving any bylaw, order, resolution or ordinance or part thereof.

*Section 7. Effective Date.* This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its approval and adoption.

**VIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS/QUESTIONS**

Daryl VonRichtofen, a resident, spoke of a question in January about who would clean the sidewalk. Thomas Jacobellis, Counsel, responded that according to the town code the property owner is responsible. Mr. VonRichtofen asked about a central sewer district being discussed in the past for the town. The Supervisor responded that the 1992 Master Plan mentioned a central sewer district and added there has been no discussion about this in the past two years. Councilman Hawthorne commented it was discussed and is very expensive to construct and especially expensive to operate on a day to day basis. Every house in the district is then taxed for building the sewer district and the day to day operation. Mr. Von Richtofen complained about speeding on Mill Street and mentioned the Harlem Valley Times is no longer in business.
